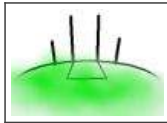

Call II Duty

Something exciting is being launched in Esperance!

Esperance Returned and Services League WA in conjunction with Australian Defence Force (subject to availability), Australian Army Museum of WA, Esperance Shire, Apex Club of Esperance, Lions Club of Esperance, 503 Army Cadets Living History Museum, and many more organisations invite you to participate in the Entrenchment Project – Australian Army Museum of WA App Launch & Armistice Learning Journey 2018.

The Esperance community recognised the need as a remote rural town to gain access to the AAMWA military history. The concept of the online interactive galleries was made possible with funds raised by the local Esperance community, which will enable other rural communities to access the benefits

of this App. It is for this reason that the coordinators wished to share the launch of the App with the community that sponsored and supported the project from its inception.

Friday the 24th August 2018 the RSL are launching the online WW2 virtual tour of the AAMWA at the Civic Centre. Local community schools and seniors will be visiting the Civic Centre throughout the day to learn about our history and explore the displays. They will be completing interactive activities (missions) at various stages of the exhibit and record this into their 'passport'. Saturday 25th August the Civic Centre exhibition will be open to the general public to explore the various displays. Our Year 6 students will be taking part in this launch at the Civic Centre on Friday, 24th August. For more information about the display, [click here](#).

On Tuesday, 14th August, a representative of the Australian Army Museum of WA will be spending the day with our students at Castletown Primary School in the lead up to this event. Graham the presenter will tailor an age appropriate talk for 20-30 min then allow students to view/touch uniforms, helmets and medals. Each session will finish with a Q&A time.
